Dear Parents/Guardians of Secondary 3 Students,

WELCOME TO TERM 1 2025

- 1. On behalf of the school and staff, we extend a very warm welcome to you in 2025! We hope that you have spent a meaningful and restful year-end holiday with your teen.
- 2. Bowen has been recognised for our Culture of Care for Students and Staff, Holistic Development of Students, and Curriculum Customisation. Leveraging these strengths, we have refreshed our strategic plan to take us into the future of education. Going forward, we will seize growth opportunities to further enhance the distinctiveness of the Bowen Experience. Our team looks forward to providing active learning experiences enabled by technology, promoting interdisciplinary thinking, as well as enabling student voice and agency.
- 3. 2024 was another good year, with Bowenians achieving success in various ways. Highlights included celebrating continued excellence for national examinations, but more importantly, our students have been Doing Well for themselves by Doing Good for others, and were recognised at various platforms such as Channel NewsAsia and Schoolbag.sg. We are most proud of them. Your continued strong support for school directions and initiatives will enable us to sustain these positive student outcomes, and is much appreciated.
- 4. As we embark on the new school year, we would like to provide you with key updates for Term 1 for our Sec 3 students.

A. Update on Health Matters, Temperature-taking Exercise & First Week of School

- 5. The school continues to prioritise student health and remains vigilant in checking in on student wellbeing. Your support is also crucial towards keeping Bowen a safe environment for students. Please remind your teen to practice good personal hygiene (e.g. washing/sanitising hands) and exercise personal and social responsibility. While mask-wearing is no longer required in a school setting, it remains an effective way to minimise the risk of infectious disease transmission. Students who prefer wearing masks are welcome to continue doing so.
- 6. If your teen is unwell, please ensure he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. Do also inform his/her Form Teachers (FTs). If your teen is recovering from respiratory-related illness, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility (e.g. by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions). Social responsibility will be crucial in preventing any infectious disease outbreak in schools. In the event your teen has to miss school, his/her learning will be supported. FTs will assign a buddy to update your teen on lessons and collect his/her learning materials. Please encourage your teen to be proactive in finding out on what he/she has missed from his/her buddy.
- 7. In Term 1, all schools will be conducting a temperature-taking exercise on Wed 15 Jan. We would appreciate it if you could help remind your teen to bring a working thermometer on Tue 14 Jan for checking, and for use on Wed 15 Jan. Do also encourage your teen to continue bringing a thermometer to school so that he/she can monitor his/her health whenever necessary.
- 8. To ease the transition back to school, please take note that the dismissal time for your teen for the first week of school will be as follows:

This will help students to understand what it means to be a leader and how to apply the knowledge to leadership opportunities in Bowen and beyond.

We seek your understanding that your teen may not be able to participate in the abovementioned activities if we do not receive the consent by the given date.

E. 2025 Home-based Learning

16. Since 2021, secondary schools have embarked on Blended Learning (BL), which is a mix of homebased and in-school activities that leverage on both online and offline approaches to learning. The objective of BL is to nurture self-directed, independent and intrinsically motivated learners.

In Bowen, the Blended Learning experience includes a student-initiated learning component called *BowenExplore!* on Home-Based Learning (HBL) Days where students explore their interests and



passions and learn beyond the formal curriculum. Many students have found it a meaningful learning experience.

This year, the school will continue to have regular HBL days starting **Fri 31 Jan**. Please refer to the table below for the HBL schedule for 2025. An Info-Sheet with more details on HBL will be sent via PG at a later date.

F. Assessment and Criteria for Progression

- 17. In recent years, MOE has introduced several policy changes under the Learn for Life movement to nurture our students to be confident and resilient learners. Since 2023, all schools have removed mid-year examinations for all levels as part of ongoing efforts to inculcate the joy of learning in our students. Sec 1-3 will have Term Assessments (TA) in Term 1 to 3 and End-of-Year Examinations in Term 4. TAs will take the form of either <u>Pen-and-Paper</u> (PP) tests or <u>Alternative Assessments</u> (AA).
- 18. More information on assessment matters will be sent to parents/guardians via PG at a later date. Information on all academic matters including assessment will also be available in the e-Student Handbook (see Section H below).
- 19. The progression of students from one level of learning to the next is based on the year-long assessment of whether students have attained the required foundation to cope with and benefit from the next level. The table below describes the criteria for progression from Sec 3 to Sec 4. **Students who do not meet the promotion criteria may be retained or laterally transferred to a less demanding course**.

H. e-Student Handbook

22. All students will receive the 2025 e-Student Handbook by the middle of Term 1 via their Student ICON emails. The Handbook will include important information such as school rules, the school calendar, curriculum hours, and progression criteria.

I. Bowen Device (HP) Policy

23. With the availability of Personal Learning Devices and lockers for all students, they will be required to keep their handphones or any other electronic devices in their lockers during curriculum hours (which



includes recess, CCA, etc.). Students can retrieve and use their handphones after curriculum hours/school dismissal at the canteen or foyer only.

- 24. Given the ubiquitous nature of technology, we hope that this practice will encourage our students to develop self-regulation in using technology wisely, "Disconnect to Connect" with their peers, reduce screen time, as well as prevent damage to, loss or theft of their devices. It will also allow them to better leverage their Personal Learning Devices as the main tool for learning without distractions from social media, game notifications and chats during curriculum time.
- 25. The school will be reminding students on the device policy and we believe that our students will be able to abide by it. However, there may be consequences (e.g. confiscation of handphone) should students be found flouting the rules.
- 26. The school seeks parents/guardians' support for the policy and help our students to use technology responsibly and appropriately. Should you need to contact your teen during curriculum hours due to any urgent matters, please contact the General Office at 6385 9466.

J. School Attendance and SMS Notification for Absenteeism

- 27. Attendance at school and school-related activities (e.g. CCA, Sports Day, enrichment days, etc) is compulsory to ensure students' holistic development and continuity of learning. Students who are absent must submit a valid medical certificate (MC) or a letter from parents with valid reasons to the relevant teacher(s) immediately upon their return to school after their absence.
- 28. To ensure regular attendance, parents/guardians are encouraged to excuse their teens from school through parent's/guardian's letters only for valid reasons such as unforeseen family circumstances. Thus, the school will only accept **up to 5 letters per semester**. If the student is unwell, we advise them to seek medical attention and be excused from school through a MC.
- 29. Students should not be travelling overseas during term time unless due to extenuating reason(s). Ongoing assessments may be impacted if student is absent from school without valid reason (e.g. no MC). - 30. Parents/guardians (i.e. primary contact person) will receive a SMS notification from school by 10.00am if your teen is absent from school. Kindly ensure your handphone number is updated in the school system through the Student Details Form (see Section K below).

32. A Student Details Form (SDF) will be sent to parents/guardians via PG. Please confirm that the information is up-to-date and respond online by **Fri 24 Jan**. For parents/guardians not onboard on PG, a hardcopy will be passed to you through your teen for verification. Should there be any changes, please update the form (indicate in red ink) and return it to FTs through your teen. As the form contains sensitive information, please remind your teen to keep the form safe and hand it to his/her FTs as soon as possible.
